A Message from the CEO

Dear Friends and Supporters,

The close of any year presents an opportunity for reflection, to consider both the past and the future. During the past year, WGTE (and all public media) were witness to the most significant disruption to its landscape since the creation of the Corporation for Public Broadcasting (CPB) in 1967. Following last year's loss of federal funding, CPB was forced to close. With its closure, all Community Service Grants were lost to stations across the nation, including WGTE. The impact on WGTE Public Media was immediate and severe, losing \$1.2 million in revenue — 21% of our annual revenue budget.


Despite this loss, WGTE remains committed to providing exceptional programming that tells stories no one else will tell, with a hyperfocus on local. This region relies on us for news, classical music and arts programming on FM 91, but also for award-winning PBS and WGTE television productions that engage, inspire, educate and entertain.

While navigating the challenges before us, we have been tremendously heartened by the outpouring of support received from all corners of this community. Countless people have stepped forward with not only their moral support, but also their generosity. New individuals became members, existing members signed up at higher levels of giving and more households and businesses made significant contributions. This revitalized support provides hope for the future, hope that together we can protect and preserve public media.

We recognize the vital role that public media plays in shaping discourse, sharing perspectives and presenting the full, vibrant spectrum of a region and its people. We embrace the opportunity to further amplify the voices that make our region exceptional.

What was accomplished in 2025 would not have been possible without the support of members, partners and donors, and we are grateful for each one. In addition, I thank the staff of WGTE Public Media for their dedication and perseverance throughout the past year. As we enter 2026 — and an exciting new chapter in this organization's history — I am confident that WGTE Public Media will continue to thrive because of its listeners and supporters.

Community

Juneteenth Screening with Maumee Indoor Theater

Approximately 75 attendees

WGTE partnered with the Maumee Indoor Theater to present the PBS documentary *Juneteenth: Faith and Freedom*, followed by a panel discussion. The presentation was educational and inspirational, with tremendous audience participation and engagement.

In-Person Programming & Station Tours

143 attendees

In collaboration with many local organizations, WGTE hosted a series of tours and hands-on learning, giving adults and children an up-close view of our radio and television operations. In addition, WGTE's outreach expanded to libraries and community centers, where screener events were held for community supporters.

Ann Anderson Stranahan Building Dedication

75 attendees

The WGTE building was dedicated to Ann Anderson Stranahan and her dedication to public television. Ms. Anderson Stranahan was one of the founders of WGTE – Channel 30 and served on the WGTE Board as well as the Board of Governors of PBS. At the dedication event, family and friends came together to celebrate her life and service to WGTE.

FM 91 on the Road

6 events

WGTE's radio and outreach team goes on the road throughout the year to broadcast live from special events and locations. These events are an opportunity to reach listeners in person and provide information and interviews from art festivals and special events.

Beyond the Mic: Meet the Faces of Voices Around Us®

6 events, 356 attendees

WGTE hosted a VAU event where our local podcasters were honored and recognized for their contributions to the initiative. All 16 creators spoke about their programs, while given an opportunity to engage with the community. The VAU initiative was launched in August 2023 and remains an essential part of our programming.

Through original footage and recent interviews, the program explains how the fire started and shares the experiences of those who responded.

In 2016, Lucas County was awarded a grant, the Safety and Justice Challenge from the John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation, seeking to safely reduce jail populations and reduce racial and ethnic disparities in local jail populations. This documentary examines the impacts that the grant has had on local communities.

Radio

WGTE serves as a voice for our communities, providing quality, highly diverse programming through readily accessible platforms.

WGTE's FM 91 is the only radio station in northwest Ohio dedicated to the arts and classical music in particular. This area enjoys a vibrant cultural presence, and FM 91 plays a leadership role in developing content that reaches many audiences. FM 91 brought the region hundreds of local productions along with its daily broadcasts of NPR news programs this year. While classical music continues to be a focal point in the morning, afternoon and evenings, the likes of longtime programs such as Jazz Spectrum and Electronic Currents bring different sounds and voices on the weekends.



Classical Music

WGTE is the only radio station in the area dedicated to classical music. Hosts Brad Cresswell and Mary Claire Murphy offer insight and inspiration as they guide listeners through the world of classical music throughout the day, into the evening and overnight.

National Public Radio

WGTE is the area's NPR provider, presenting *Morning Edition*, *All Things Considered* and more, for listeners throughout northwest and west central Ohio and southeast Michigan.

Electronic Currents

Sundays at 8 p.m.

Richard Paton presents a wide range of Electronic Dance Music, from the rhythmic energy of House to the soaring melodies of Epic Trance, the skipping beats of Drum and Bass to the mellow soundscapes of Chill-out.

Hosted by Fritz Byers, *Jazz Spectrum* is designed as an anthology showcasing the wondrous diversity of jazz, from its earliest roots to today's cutting-edge composers and performers.

Brad Cresswell hosts this award-winning program featuring live concert recordings from the New Music Festival and Music at the Forefront, alongside the discography of composers, alumni and BGSU faculty.

At its foundation, WGTE is an educational resource with an enduring commitment to lifelong learning for all ages within our communities.

As we work to fulfill our vision to serve as a trusted, valued, dynamic and essential resource for quality and innovation, our educational efforts are central to everything we do. By engaging young people through television, in the classroom and in our community, we strive to ensure that K-12 educators, students, parents and caregivers have the resources needed to improve literacy and school readiness throughout the region.

Be My Neighbor Day

Presented at the Toledo Zoo, Be My Neighbor Day provided crafts, resources and activities to help increase community and social and emotional learning. Admission to the Zoo was free to Lucas County residents, with 375 children and 400 adults participating.

We presented a series of PBS KIDS' programming screenings that included tailored educational activities, character appearances, story time and more.




The Four Hundred & Nineteen powered by WGTE
